Over the last decade, the persecution of Uyghurs in China has attracted global attention. In this talk, Abduweli Ayup will discuss his 2013 arrest for teaching the Uyghur language to kindergarteners, his activism, and his advocacy for Uyghur language education in China and the diaspora. Abduweli Ayup is a writer, activist, and linguist, specializing in Uyghur-language education. He founded the nonprofit Uyghur Hjelp in 2016 and has lived in Bergen, Norway since 2019 as a writer-in-residence through the International Cities of Refuge Network (ICORN) program.
